Welcome Back! St. Matthew's has resumed community worship! The Feast of St. Matthew was celebrated on Sunday, September 20, 2020.

All diocesan precautions were observed including face masks, social distancing, and hand sanitizing. There was no procession to the altar, and all readings were done from behind the altar rail, to reduce the number of people moving around the sanctuary. Organ music was played but there was no singing with the exception of Owen, who is a beautiful soloist. The Communion was distributed by the Celebrant standing at the altar. Communicants lined up single file to receive it, and then carry it back to the pew to lift their mask and consume it.

George Hahn, our senior warden, has been very busy at the church since our last service in early March until our re-opening on September 20th. Here is an update of what he has accomplished since we were last together.

+ The alarm panel in the parish hall which was damaged from the storm in July has been replaced. The sign in front of the church was also destroyed during that storm and a new one has been ordered. Footings will be prepared and the sign will be installed by the end of the year.

+ The trees and shrubs in front of the church and along the driveway were cut down, bundled up and discarded in preparation for the new landscaping project.

+ The doors, the benches and the trim outside were all given a fresh coat of red paint.

+ The front of the church was scraped and painted in preparation for the new cross. George could be seen up on scaffolding scraping and then painting the front of the church in preparation for the cross.







+ George and some of his co-workers then built the new cross, which represented a savings of thousands of dollars. It was painted red and LED lighting was installed behind the cross to replace the flood lights in front on the lawn.







Installation of the cross was quite an undertaking. A bucket truck was rented and the cross was lifted up and installed on the front of the church. You can see George up in the bucket during the painting and the installation.

The bell was refurbished and received a new coat of gold paint and new white pull cords.

+ Sprinklers were donated and installed in front of the church and along the driveway in preparation for the new landscaping project. Thank you Jim Albro, for this wonderful donation.

+ The Adopt-a-Plant landscaping project was a tremendous success. A large assortment of plants were selected to landscape the front and side of the church. All of the plants have been adopted by friends and family of St. Matthew's. Spring will be a beautiful time when everything blooms!



+ The church was wired for broadcasting live Sunday worship services on YouTube. This involved four cameras, a computer and a control panel.
